***for the launch of public consultation from 28 September to 18 October 2012 on
the draft revised BEREC Common Positions on Wholesale Local Access,
Wholesale Broadband Access and Wholesale Leased lines***

The revised BEREC Common Positions (CPs) on Wholesale Local Access (WLA), Wholesale Broadband Access (WBA) and Wholesale Leased Lines (WLL) were discussed and agreed at the BEREC Board of Regulators meeting in Limassol on 27 September 2012.

One of BEREC's key roles is to develop and disseminate best practices and to support the harmonised application of remedies amongst National Regulatory Authorities (NRAs). To this end, and as noted in its work programme, in 2012 BEREC committed itself to review and update the three CPs on WLA, WBA and WLL. These CPs were originally agreed in 2006/07 and BEREC undertook this review in order to align them with the latest technological/market developments (e.g. NGA).

In order to aid stakeholders, BEREC prepared an [introductory document](#) to the consultation setting **the context and background to this review**, which is published at the same time as the three draft BEREC CPs.

For the avoidance of doubt, BEREC is not expecting stakeholders to comment again on issues relating to non-discrimination as these were consulted on in March 2012.

With the above context in mind, BEREC is submitting the following documents for public consultation:

The role of the public consultation is to increase transparency and to provide BEREC with valuable feedback from all interested parties.

In accordance with the BEREC's policy on public consultation, BEREC will publish a high level report summarising how it took stakeholder contributions into account. BEREC will also publish all contributions on its website, taking into account stakeholders' requests for confidentiality (which should be clearly indicated in the submissions made).

The public consultation will run from 28 September to 18 October 2012.
